

1. The Basics

Front View of Phone



Your Phone's Features

- **1. Side Camera Key:** Press to display Camera mode while the phone is open, or press and hold while the phone is closed. Lets you mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls.
- **2. Volume Keys:** Lets you adjust the receiver volume during a call, or ringer volume in Standby mode. Lets you mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls.
- **3. Headset Jack:** Insert the plug of the headset (sold separately) for hands-free listening.
- 4. LED (green/red light): Incoming Call = Green blinks/ Notification (Message, Alerts, etc.) = Red blinks.

- **5. Camera Lens:** This built-in camera lens allows you to use auto focus function.
- **6. Sub LCD:** Lets you monitor the phone's status and see who's calling without opening the phone.
- 7. Earpiece: Lets you hear the caller's voice.
- 8. Main LCD (display): Displays the phone's main menu, features, modes, etc.
- **9. Softkey (left)**: Lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom left line on the Main LCD.
- 10. Navigation Key: Lets you navigate quickly and easily through the menu options. Press ▲ or ▼ of the Navigation key to adjust the receiver volume during a call. It takes a shortcut to the menu by pressing, ► = Phone Book (Find Name),
 ◄= My Shortcut, ▲= Messaging and ▼= Downloads.
- **11. MENU/OK:** Lets you see the phone's menus and select menu options.
- **12. Camera Key:** Press to display Camera menu. Press and hold to display Camera mode.
- **13. TALK:** Lets you place a call, receive a call, answer Call Waiting, use Three-Way Calling and Voice Dial.
- 14. Charger Jack: Connects Travel Charger (included).
- 15. Accessories Connector: Connects accessories such as USB cable.
- 16. Microphone: To speak into or record your voice.
- **17. Number Keys:** Lets you enter numbers, letters and characters, and navigate within menus. Press and hold 2-9 key to make a Speed Dial call.
- **18. END/POWER**: Turns the phone ON and OFF. Lets you disconnect a call while talking or mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls.
- **19. BACK:** Allows you to clear characters from the screen, mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls or display Time/Date while the phone is in use.
- **20. Softkey (right):** Lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom right line on the Main LCD.

Viewing the Display Screen

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your display screen.

- ► Till shows your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.
- ▶ 🔀 means your phone cannot find a signal.
- ▶ ∥ tells you a call is in progress.
- ▶ 🔢 indicates the 1X services are available.
- ▶ 🔀 indicates the 1X Services are not available.
- Indicates 1X service is connected, but voice calls can be sent or received.
- ▶ 1 indicates 1X service access is active.
- ▶ 🛃 indicates you have text messages waiting.
- indicates you have voicemail messages waiting. Press and hold 1 to call your voicemail box.
- Image: Image:
- ▶ 🖪 indicates you are roaming on digital service network.
- ▶ III indicates you are roaming on analogue service network.
- ▶ ▲ indicates your phone is on analogue service network.
- If a shows the level of your battery charge. The more black you see, the more power you have left. It turns I while charging.
- ▶ 📲 indicates you have menus to scroll (in four directions).
- ▶ IIII indicates the vibrate feature is set to ON.
- ▶ 🕼 indicates volume level 4 and vibrate feature is set to ON.
- ▶ ⊕ indicates the Location Service of your phone is enabled.
- ▶ 🖗 indicates the Location Service of your phone is disabled.
- ▶ 💽 indicates you have new caller's message.
- ▶ 🔊 indicates the Screen Call Auto setting is ON.
- ▶ 🖥 indicates you have new downloaded data.

Turning Your Phone ON and OFF

Turning Your Phone ON

To turn your phone on, press END/O.

Once your phone is ON, it displays "Looking for service..." which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for PCS Service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to save your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

Turning Your Phone OFF

Press END for two seconds until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.


Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

Using the Battery

Installing the Battery

Your phone comes with a LiIon battery. Follow these steps to install it:

- **1.** Place the battery into the space beneath the antenna with the metal contacts at the bottom, facing downward.
- **2.** Gently press down until it's in place and the battery release latch snaps.



Removing the Battery

To remove your battery, follow these easy steps:

- **1.** Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
- 2. Push the battery release latch up and hold the battery.
- **3**. Then pull it up and out at a 45-degree angle.



Charging the Battery

Your phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon i appears and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use an approved desktop charger, travel charger, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, and browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Using the Travel Charger

To use the travel charger provided with your phone:

- 1. Plug the travel charger into a wall outlet.
- **2.** Plug the other end of the travel charger into the side of your phone (with the battery installed).
- Charging when your phone is turned on: The battery icon appears on the display while charging. The battery icon turns to will when charging is complete.
- ► Charging when your phone is turned off: The battery icon → appears, and the message "BATTERY CHARGING-Power Off-" is shown on the display while charging. When the battery is completely discharged, you may wait for several minutes until the message is shown on the display. The battery icon turns to → and message changes to "CHARGING COMPLETE-Power Off-" when charging is complete.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

Displaying Your Phone Number

- **1**. Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Phone Info** and press **MENU**.
- **3.** Highlight **Phone#** and press **MENU**.

Note: To access the phone's main menu, press (From standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the Navigation key and pressing (FR), or you can press the number corresponding to the menu item on your keypad.

Making and Answering Calls


Making Calls

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- **2.** Enter a phone number. (If you make a mistake while dialling, press **BACK** to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold **BACK** to erase the entire number.)
- 3. Press TALK.
- 4. When you're finished, press (ND/O).

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press TALK twice.

Tip: When making calls off the home network, always dial using 11 digits (1 + area code + phone number).

Important: When you use your phone to maximize performance, extend the antenna and do not touch the antenna.



Answering Calls

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on. If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.
- When a call comes in, answer the call by pressing TALK.
 Depending on your settings, your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:
- ► The phone rings or vibrates.
- ▶ The LED flashes.
- The backlight illuminates.
- ▶ The screen displays an incoming call message.
- ▶ If available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.
- ► If the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book, the Phone Book entry's name is displayed.

The following options are also displayed by pressing I . To select an option, highlight it and press I.

- Answer to answer the call.
- **Don't Answer** to hang up the incoming call and return to Web while you are in the Web operation. (This feature appears when Web access is dormant.)
- ► Screen Call to answer the call by using pre-recorded announcement. (This feature appears when you are in service area or digital roaming area.) See page 87 for setting up.
- Quiet Ringer to mute the ringer. (This feature appears when the ringer is set.)

Note: If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.

3. To disconnect the call, press END/0.

Changing Ringer Volume

To change the ringer volume, adjust the Volume keys when the phone is in Standby mode.

Note: To change the ringer volume from the main menu, see "Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings" on page 20.

Adjusting Volume During a Conversation

Whether you need to hear more or less of a conversation, adjust the Volume keys or press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown of the Navigation key during a call.

Muting a Call

To use this function during a call:

Press (M), highlight Mute and press (M). When the phone is muted, "Mute" appears on the display.

To unmute a call:

Press (MRW), highlight Unmute and press (MRW).

Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, your phone displays the Missed Call Notification.

To call the last missed call:

Simply press TALK.

To display the list of Missed Calls:

Press any key except **TALK**, then press **View** (left softkey). To make a call from the list, highlight an entry you wish to call and press **TALK**.

> You cannot return calls to entries listed as No Caller ID.

Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial **9 1 1** and press **TALK**), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted. Once the dial is made, you will enter Emergency mode. The phone tries to dial to 911 automatically until the dial will be connected. While you are in the Emergency mode, all phone calls can be received.

To exit from the Emergency mode, follow these instructions:

1. Press (ND/O), (BACK), or enter a phone number.

- or -

- 1. Press () to display the options.
- 2. Highlight Exit Emergency and press

Dialling Options

Dialling options are displayed when you press (Weilly) after entering numbers in the Standby mode.

To select an option, highlight it and press

- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Save Phone# to save the phone number in your Internal Phone Book. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 14.)
- ► **Hard Pause** to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialling and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)
- ► **12-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialling and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)
- **Hyphen** to insert a hyphen manually where you like.

Tip: To Speed Dial a phone number, press and hold the appropriate Speed Dial location from 2-9. See page 35 for setting.

This option appears when you enter four or more digits and press MEW.

► Find to display Internal Phone Book entries that ends with the digits you enter. (See "Finding a Phone Number" on page 15.)

This option appears when you enter numbers for Text Messaging or Picture Messaging and press (Sec.).

► Send Message to send a text message. See page 106 for details. To attach pictures, see page 94.

In-Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options by pressing .

To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- ▶ **Flash** to answer an incoming Call Waiting call or connect a third party during Three-Way Calling.
- Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select Unmute to reactivate the microphone.
- **Three -Way Call** to call a third party.
- ► **Call History** to view previous outgoing, incoming and missed calls. (See "Managing Call History" on page 46.)
- ▶ Phone Book to search for a number, add an entry or view your number. (See "Internal Phone Book" on page 49.)
- **Messaging** to view text messages. (See "Messaging" on page 104.)
- ► Voicemail (See page 116.)
- Settings to view and change sound display and other phone settings. (See "Your Phone's Settings" on page 17.)
- **Calendar** to view the calendar and any events or alarms. (See page 62.)
- ▶ VoiceServices to record a voice memo. (See page 82.)
- ▶ **Phone Info** to view your phone number, the help menu and software version of the phone. (See page 70.)

Note: Flash menu appears in Call Waiting and Three-Way Call. Mute menu does not appear during a 911 call.

End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Internal Phone Book, the phone number and the duration of the call is displayed. You can display the following menu options by pressing I within 10 seconds after disconnecting the call.

To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- Call Again to dial the phone number.
- Save Phone# to save the phone number in your Internal Phone Book. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on the next page.)

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is in your Internal Phone Book, the Phone Book entry name, phone number and the duration of the call are displayed. You can display the following menu options by pressing () within 10 seconds after disconnecting the call.

To select an option, highlight it and press (MEN).

- **Call Again** to dial the phone number.
- **Go to Phone Book** to save the other phone number into the same entry in your Internal Phone Book.

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

Saving a Phone Number

Your phone can store a total of 500 phone numbers in 300 Internal Phone Book entries. Each Phone Book entry can store seven phone numbers, and the entry's name can contain 16 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Internal Phone Book entries alphabetically.

To save a number from the standby mode:

- **1**. Enter a phone number.
- 2. Press MENU .
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press (Sec. 2014).
- 4. Select a label by highlighting **Home**, **Work**, **Mobile**, **Pager**, **Data**, **Fax** or **No Label** and press **Mathematical Selection**.
- 5. Enter a Name and press (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 50.) Or you can also save the phone number without a name by pressing (R) from the name entry display, highlighting **Yes** and then pressing (R). If you have already stored entries in the Phone Book, you are prompted to select the following entry modes:
- New Name to enter a name directly.
- **From Phone Book** to select a name from Phone Book entry list.
- 6. Press Save (left softkey).

After you have saved the number, the new Internal Phone Book entry is displayed. (See "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 49.)

Finding a Phone Number

You can search Internal Phone Book entries for phone numbers that ends with the digits you entered.

To find a phone number:

- 1. Enter the last four or more digits of the number and press (). The more numbers you enter, the more specific the search becomes.
- 2. Highlight **Find** and press .
- **3.** The Phone Book entry list that ends with the digits you entered appears.
- **4**. Highlight your desired entry.
 - Press to display the entry details. Press TALK to dial.

Dialling and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers. If you select a hard pause, the next set of numbers are sent when you press **TAUK**. If you select a 2-second pause, your phone automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

- 1. Enter the phone number and press (MRV).
- 2. Highlight either **Hard Pause** or **2-Sec. Pause** and press **CRP**. Hard Pauses are displayed as a "H" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- 4. Press (), highlight **Call** to dial the number or **Save Phone#** to save the number in your Internal Phone Book and press ().

When dialling a number with a hard pause, press **TALK** (or press **TALK**) and highlight **Send Tone** and press **(TALK**) to send the next set of numbers.

Dialling From the Internal Phone Book

To dial directly from an Internal Phone Book entry:

1. Press **MENU** to access the main menu.

2. Highlight Phone Book and press (SP).

3. Highlight **Find Name** and press (1989).

Shortcut: Press the right Navigation key to list entries.

- **4.** Use your Navigation key to scroll through the Phone Book list and highlight one of the appropriate entries and press **(NEW)**.
- **5**. Highlight the number you wish to call.
- **6.** Press **Options** (right softkey) for the menu options.
- 7. Highlight **Call** and press MENU.
- For more options, see "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 49.

Tip: You can also make a call by pressing **Call** (left softkey) during step 5 above.

Using One-Touch Speed Dialling

With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9. (See page 35 for storing a Speed Dial number.)

To use One-Touch Dialling for Speed Dial locations 2-9:

Press and hold the appropriate key for few seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialled when it shows "Connecting...".

2. Your Phone's Settings

Reminder: To access the phone's main menu, press (Removed) from standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the Navigation key and pressing (Removed).

Sound Settings

Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls

Using Voice Prompt

- ► Silence All to set all the ringer volume to off. (Only appears in Ringer Volume Setting.) See "Silence All" on page 22.

To adjust Earpiece volume:

Alert Notification

Your phone comes with several different options to keep you aware of what's going on by sounding the alert or ringer.

- Service sets alert On or Off for network services parameter changes.
- ► Voicemail sets alert to notify you of caller's message(s).
- **Messaging** sets alert to notify you of text message(s).
- Minute Beep sets a minute reminder that beeps ten seconds before the end of each minute during a call.
- Signal Fade sets alert to notify you when your phone loses a signal during a call.

To set the alerts:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight Sounds and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight Alerts and press (1987).
- 5. Highlight your desired option and press 🐨
- 6. If you selected Service, Minute Beep or Signal Fade, select On or Off. If you selected Voicemail or Messaging, select Once, Repeat Alert or Off.

Tip: Repeat Alert sounds every two minutes for twenty minutes.

Silence All

- 4. Highlight **Ringer/Key Vol** and press .
- 5. Highlight **Ringer Volume** and press (MRP).

- To deactivate this feature, select a volume level you wish during step 6 above.

Tip: When Ringer Volume is set as Silence All, other items are changed to Off and cannot be highlighted by cursor.

Airplane Mode

When your phone is in Airplane mode, it cannot send or receive any calls (except for 911 dialling) or access online information. You may still use the phone's other features, such as Voice Memos, Calculator, Calendar, etc., while you are in Airplane mode.

1. Press (NEW) to access the main menu.

- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight Airplane Mode and press
- 4. The display shows a message. Press () or **OK** (left softkey).
- Press Cancel (right softkey) to return to the setting display.

Note: While in Airplane mode, your phone's standby screen will display "Phone Off."

- 5. Select either **5 Seconds** or **15 Seconds** and press (ER).
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

Setting Call Answer

This feature enables you to answer incoming calls by opening the clamshell so that you don't have to press **TALK**.

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight Call Answer and press
- 5. Select **Open Flip** and press .
- ► To answer the call by pressing TALK, select TALK Key during step 5 above.

Setting Any Key Answer

This feature allows you to answer incoming calls by pressing any key (except (MDO), (MACK), (MRO), Side Camera key, Volume keys and Navigation key).

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight Any Key Answer and press
- 5. Select **On** and press **Meru**.
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

Setting Side Key Guard

This feature enables you to lock your side key (Side Camera key and Volume keys) while the clamshell is closed.

- 2. Highlight Settings and press (Setting).
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press **MENU**.
- 4. Highlight Side Key Guard and press ().
- 5. Select **On** and press **OR**.
- Side Key Guard appears on the Sub LCD when you press any side key while the clamshell is closed.
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Off** at step 5 above.

Note: This feature does not apply when the clamshell is open.

Sleep Mode

This feature helps conserve your battery power by restricting the display.

- 5. Highlight Main LCD or Sub LCD and press

Setting Message Notification

You can see message notification when you receive a text message or Voicemail while you are in Web applications or Browser mode.

- 4. Highlight **Display Pop-up** and press
- 5. Check the box next to **Games/Apps** or **Browser** and press **Save** (left softkey).

This feature allows you to connect Web Alerts page automatically if possible when you receive. See page 104 for Web Alerts.

- 4. Highlight **Push Options** and press **ERP**.
- 5. Select Yes and press (MENU)
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **No** during step 5 above.

With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9.

You must enter your lock code to view the Security menu.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of your phone number or 0000.

Locking Your Phone

When your phone is locked, you can only receive incoming calls or make calls to 911, Customer Service, or special numbers.

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" above), highlight Lock Phone and press (SEP).
- 2. Highlight Lock Now or On Power-up and press ().
- 3. Depending on your preference, highlight either Full Lock or **Except Incom.Calls** and press **CERP**.
- Full Lock: All phone calls except for emergency number,
 (Customer Service) or special numbers cannot be made. No phone calls can be received except for special numbers.
- Except Incom.Calls: All phone calls except for emergency number,
 1 (Customer Service) or special numbers cannot be made, but all incoming calls can be received.

Tip: If you want to cancel the "On Power-up" setting before turning the phone off, select **Unlocked** during step 2 above.

Unlocking Your Phone

Changing the Lock Code

Note: Restricted incoming calls are forwarded to voicemail.

Using Special Numbers

You can save three special numbers in addition to your Internal Phone Book entries (the same number may be in both directories). You can make and receive calls from special numbers even when your phone is locked.

To add or replace a special number:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 36), highlight **Others** and press (Security .
- 2. Highlight Special #s and press ().
- **3.** Highlight the box under the entry number and press .
- 4. Enter the number you wish to add and press (
 - or -

Press **Options** (right softkey), then highlight **From Phone Book** or **Voicemail** and press **CPP**.

To insert pauses into a number:

- **1.** From step 4 above, enter the phone number and press **Options** (right softkey) for the options.
- 2 Highlight Hard Pause, 2-Sec. Pause, or Hyphen and press (EP).
- 3. Finish entering the rest of the numbers and press .

Erasing the Internal Phone Book

Erasing the Downloads

Resetting Your Pictures Account

You can use this feature when other people use your phone. With this feature, other people cannot use your account without your password.

4. Roaming Understanding Roaming

Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the home network and whether your phone is operating in analogue or digital mode. The following chart indicates what you'll see depending on where you're using your phone.

Tip: Remember, when you are using your phone off the home network, always dial numbers using 11 digits (1 + area code + number).

Roaming on Digital Networks

When you're roaming on digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the home network. You may not be able to access certain features, such as Web.

Roaming on Analogue Networks

When you roam on analogue networks, you will experience a similar quality provided by other analogue carriers today. Although some features, such as Web, will be unavailable, you can still make and receive calls and access voicemail. You will experience a few differences:

- You are more likely to experience, cross-talk, fade-out, and dropped calls.
- Some features which are standard on the home network, such as call waiting, direct international dialling, are unavailable.
- Though callers can leave voicemail messages while you are roaming, you may not receive notification until you return to the home network.
- There are security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analogue services today.
- Your battery needs recharging sooner when you use your phone for analogue roaming.

Note: If you're on a call when you leave the home network and enter an area where roaming is available (whether digital or analogue), your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the home network.

Note: When using your phone in analogue mode, the handset may feel warm. This behaviour is normal for analogue operation.

Setting Your Phone's Roam Mode

Your phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the **Roaming** menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts.

Set Mode

Choose from four different settings on your dual band/tri mode phone to control your roaming experience:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Roaming and press .
- 4. To select an option, select it and press .
- Automatic: This setting seeks Service. When Service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
- Home Only: This setting allows you to access the home network only and prevents roaming on other networks.
- **Digital Only:** This setting forces the phone to seek a digital roaming system.
- Analogue Only: This setting forces the phone to seek an analogue roaming system. The previous setting (Automatic, Home Only, or Digital Only) is restored the next time the phone is turned on.

6. Managing Call History

Viewing History

You'll find the Call History feature very helpful. It is a list of the last 20 phone numbers (or Internal Phone Book entries) for each calls that you placed, accepted, or missed. Call History makes redialling a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.

- **1**. Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Call History** and press **Call**.
- 3. Highlight Outgoing Calls, Incoming Calls, or Missed Calls and press ().

Call History Options

For additional information and options on a particular call, highlight a Call History entry and press **EXP**.

This feature gives you the option of selecting:

- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- **Send Message** to send a text message. See page 106 for details. To attach pictures, see page 94.
- Save Phone# to save the phone number, if it is not in your Internal Phone Book (if applicable). If the caller's phone number is already stored in the Phone Book, Go to Phone Book appears instead. (See "Saving a Phone Number From Call History" on the next page.)
- Prefix to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number. (See "Prefixing a Phone Number From Call History" on page 48.)
- **View** to view the caller's information.
- **Erase** to erase the entry.

Making a Call From Call History

- 1. Press (New to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Call History and press
- 3. Highlight Outgoing Calls, Incoming Calls, or Missed Calls.
- 4. Press MENU.
- 5. Highlight the entry you want to call by scrolling through the list.
- 6. Press TALK.

- or -Press (Mex), highlight **Call** and press (Mex).

Note: You cannot make calls from Call History to entries identified as No ID or Restricted.

Saving a Phone Number From Call History

- 1. Highlight the call history entry you want to save.
- **2**. Press **MENU** to display the options.
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press (1989).
- **4.** Highlight appropriate label (Home, Work, Mobile, Pager, Data, Fax, or No Label) and press **WEP**.
- 5. Enter a Name and press (You can also save the phone number without a name by pressing (rom the name entry display, highlight **Yes** and then press (rom). If you have already stored entries in the Phone Book, you are prompted to select from the following entry modes:
- New Name to enter a name directly.
- From Phone Book to select a name from Phone Book entry list.
- **6.** Press **Save** (left softkey).

Note: You cannot save phone numbers already in your Internal Phone Book or from calls identified as No ID or Restricted. If the selected entry has already been stored in the phone book, **Go to Phone Book** appears.

Prefixing a Phone Number From Call History

If you need to make a call from Call History and you happen to be outside your local area code, you can add the appropriate prefix by following these steps:

- 1. Highlight a call history entry and press (1).
- 2. Highlight **Prefix** and press
- 3. Enter the digits you want to add to the number.
 If you want to save the number, press and select
 Save Phone# from options. If not, the changes only apply to the current call.

To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Save Phone# to store the phone number in your Internal Phone Book.
- ► Hard Pause to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialling and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)
- ▶ **12-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialling and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)

Erasing Call History

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Call History and press (Sec. 1).
- 3. Highlight **Erase History** and press (1989).
- 4. Highlight the category you want to erase and press ().
- 5. Highlight **Yes** and press **MENU**.
- > You can also select **All Calls** during step 4 above to erase all entries.

Internal Phone Book Entry Options

To access an Internal Phone Book Entry's options, display the entry list, highlight an entry and press (), then select a phone number and press (), then select an option, highlight it and press (). To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- **Edit** to edit your desired label.
- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Send Message to send a text message. See page 106 for details. To attach pictures, see page 94 (only Mobile label).
- **Call Alarm** to set the call alarm to the entry (see page 65).
- Set Speed Dial to set the Speed Dial to the entry (see page 35).
- ▶ Set Voice Dial to set the Voice Dial to the entry (see page 82).
- Prefix to alter a phone number by adding additional numbers (see the previous page).

When you are in edit display, the following options are displayed:

- Send Message to send a text message (only Mobile and Email label).
- ▶ Visit Site to go to the website (only Web label).
- **Edit** to edit your desired label (only Web and Email label).
- **Erase** to erase your desired label.

Tip: You can view the next entry by pressing the right Navigation key or view the previous entry by pressing the left Navigation key.

You can erase the selected entry from the Phone Book list.

- 1. Press the right Navigation key to display the Phone Book list.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Erase Entry** and press .
- 4. Highlight Yes and press (NY).

Selecting a Character Input Mode

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding an Internal Phone Book entry).

- 1. When you display a screen where you can enter text, press the right softkey button.
- 2. Select a character input mode, highlight it and press .
- **T9Word** to enter characters using T9 Text Input (see below).
- Alphabet to enter characters by tapping the keypad (see page 52).
- **SYMBOL** to enter symbols (see page 53).
- **NUMBER** to enter numbers (see page 53).
- CANNED SUFFIX to enter a canned suffix (see page 53).
- **SMILEYS** to enter smiley pictures (see page 53).

Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the **T9 Word** mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" above.)

T9 Text Input analyses the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) If the word you want does not display after you have entered all the letters, press (but to scroll through additional word selections. To accept a word and insert a space, press (but the section).

If you make a mistake, press **BACK** to erase a single character. Press and hold **BACK** to delete an entire entry.

Adding a Word to the T9 Database

If a word you want to enter does not display as an option when you are using T9 Text Input, you can add it to the database.

- **1.** Select the **Alphabet** input mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on the previous page.)
- Enter the word using multi-tap text entry. (See "Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad" on the next page.)
 Then press the right softkey, highlight **T9 Word** and press (Section 1).
 The word will appear as an option the next time you scroll through options during T9 Text Input.

Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the **Alphabet** mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 50). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.

Entering Numbers, Symbols, Canned Suffix and Smileys

Entering NUMBER

- 1. In a text entry field, press the right softkey.
- 2. Highlight **NUMBER** and press (MRV).
- **3**. Press the corresponding numeric key to enter the number.

Shortcut: Press and hold the corresponding numeric key to enter the number directly in alphabet mode or T9 mode.

Entering SYMBOL

- 1. In a text entry field, press the right softkey.
- 2. Highlight SYMBOL and press .
- **3.** Highlight the line that includes your desired symbol.
- 4. Press the corresponding key (1~8) with each symbol.

Highlight your desired symbol by using the Navigation key, and press 🐨.

Entering CANNED SUFFIX

- **Send** (left softkey) to send an Email (only Email label).
- **Go** (left softkey) to go to the website (only Web label).
- Edit (right softkey) to edit the Email or Web address. (Email and Web label only)

Shortcut: From the Standby mode, press the right Navigation key to display the Find Name feature.

Finding Entries

To find an Internal Phone Book entry by entering the first letters:

- **1**. Press \blacktriangleright of the Navigation key.
- **2**. Enter the first letter of the name or part of the name using multi-tap method.
- **3.** Highlight your desired entry by scrolling through the phone book entry and press **MRP**.
- If you enter a single letter, the display shows the list beginning with the letter you entered.

- **5**. The Voice Dial number's list appears.

Adding a Phone Number or Address to an Internal Phone Book Entry

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Phone Book** and press **MRV**.
- 3. Highlight Find Name and press ().
- Press ► of the Navigation key for the shortcut (steps 1 through 3).
- 4. Highlight the entry you wish to add phone numbers/email/web addresses to and press (NEW).
- 5. Highlight a phone number, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Edit**, and press **WEW**.
 - or -

Highlight an Email address or Web address, and press **Edit** (right softkey).

- 6. Highlight the box under the label you wish to add.

- ▶ **No Label** to change the entry's number.
- **Email** to change the entry's email address.
- Web to change the entry's Web address.
- **Ringer** to assign a ringer type to the entry. (See "Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry" on the next page.)
- Image to assign an image type to the entry. (See "Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry" on the next page.)

Tip: You can also store the phone number in the Pager, Data, or Fax category.

Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry

You can assign a ringer/image type to an Internal Phone Book entry so you can identify the caller by the ringer or image type.

- 2. Select the entry you want to set as the incoming ringer or image and press ().
- **3.** Highlight a phone number, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Edit**, and press **CPP**.

Highlight an Email address or Web address, and press **Edit** (right softkey).

- 4. Select the menu under **Ringer** or **Image** by scrolling up or down and press ().
- 5. Highlight your desired ringer type or image and press (
- Get New: start up the Browser and you can select an item to download.
- ▶ Normal: Ringer equivalent to With Caller ID or Roaming setting (see page 17). Image equivalent to Incoming Calls setting (see page 26).
- ▶ None: the setting equivalent to off.
- **Pictures:** to set a picture in Picture Wallet. (Image only. See page 98.)
- 6. Press Save (left softkey).
- ► To confirm the ringer, highlight **Ringer** and press **Play** (right softkey).
- ► To see a display preview, press **Preview** (right softkey) during step 6 above, and press **Sub LCD** (right softkey) to see the Sub LCD preview. (You may also check the image through the external display.)
- To adjust the position of the image, use your Navigation key during step 6 above.
- ▶ If you set an Animation Ringer (indicated with ∰ icon) and an Image, your phone plays the Animation Ringer and displays the selected Image.
- > You should have pictures or downloaded data to set Image.

Secret Internal Phone Book Entries

You can hide an entry's phone number(s) by making them secret, which requires your lock code to edit the entry. The entry name is still displayed, but the entry's phone numbers are replaced by "(Secret)".

- **1**. Press \blacktriangleright of the Navigation key.
- **2.** Scroll to the Internal Phone Book entry you want to tag Secret.
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the menu options.
- 4. Highlight Set Secret and press .
- 5. Enter the 4-digit lock code.
- 6. Select **On** and press **MENU**.
- ► To make an entry public, select **Off** during step 6 above.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of phone number, or 0000.

Dialling Services

You must be in digital mode to access Services.

To dial a service:

- **1.** Press **Were** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Phone Book** and press .
- 3. Highlight Services and press
- 4. Highlight Cust Service or Dir Assist and press ().
- 5. Press TALK.

- or -

Press (), highlight Call and press ().

Storing Special Numbers in the Phone Book

Using the Pause Feature

Generally, when you call an automated system like voicemail boxes or credit card companies, you are required to enter a password or calling card number. Rather than entering the numbers manually each time, you can store the numbers in your Internal Phone Book, separated by special characters called "pauses".

Using Two Different Types of Pauses

There are two different types of pauses that you can use when storing a number in your Internal Phone Book.

- Hard Pause causes the phone to stop dialling until you select Send Tone or press (TALK). To display Send Tone, press (WW).
- 2-Sec. Pause waits two seconds before sending the next string of digits.

To insert pauses into a number:

- **1**. Enter the number you want to dial.
- **2.** Press to display the menu options.
- **3.** Highlight:
- Hard Pause for a hard pause.
- **2-Sec. Pause** for a timed pause.
- **Hyphen** for a hyphen (for visual appearance only).
- **4**. Press **()** to insert a pause or manual hyphen.
- **5.** Finish entering the rest of the numbers, then dial or save the entered number. See page 14 for saving.

Managing Schedules

Calendar

Use the Calendar to remind you of events or important calls you need to make. You can schedule up to 100 events, 15 Call Alarms and 20 To Do Items.

Setting the Time/Date

In a no service area or Analogue service area, it's necessary to set actual time before using the Calendar function. Set the current Time/Date by using numeric keys and/or the Navigation key $(\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright)$: move cursor, \blacktriangle/\forall : change value). To display the time setting display, press RW, then highlight **Calendar** and press RW.

It's available from 12:00 AM, Jan 1, 2000 to 11:59 PM, Dec 31, 2099.

Setting Holidays

You can set your personal holidays by displaying the date in red on the Calendar display. The default holidays displayed in red are Sundays and National holidays.

You can set holidays from Jan 1, 2000 to Dec 31, 2020.

- **1**. Press **Merry** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Calendar and press
- 3. Highlight the day you want to set to the holiday by using the Navigation key (◄: previous day, ►: next day, ▲: previous week, ▼: next week).
- **4.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight Set Date or Set Weekly, and press (NEW). Options:
- **Set Date** sets the selected date to the holiday.
- **Set Weekly** sets the weekly holidays.
- **Reset Date** resets the holiday setting for the selected date.
- Reset Weekly resets the weekly holiday setting.
- **Reset All** resets all the holiday settings and returns to the default settings.
- 6. If you selected **Set Weekly**, **Reset Weekly**, or **Reset All**, you'll be prompted to select **Yes** or **No**.

Tip: The current day is framed by a rectangle.

Adding an Event to the Scheduler

- **1**. Press **MEN** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Calendar and press
- **3.** Highlight the day you want to add an event by using the Navigation key and press (RP).
- 4. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 5. Highlight Add Event and press (1989).

- 7. Enter the description and press without entering the description.
- 8. Select the menu under the following options and press ():
- Description Entering a description of your event (up to 14 characters).
- **From** Scheduling the start time.
- **To** Scheduling the end time.
- **Location** Editing the location of your event (up to 14 characters).
- Alarm Select the ringer you wish to set.
- Alarm Time Editing the alarm time (number of hours or minutes before the event starts). Default alarm time is 10 minutes.
- Repeat Repeating the event. Select None, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, or Yearly.
- 9. Press Save (left softkey) to schedule the event.

Tip: Press the Navigation key up or down to scroll by week through the Scheduler calendar, and the Volume keys to scroll by month.

Press (MOD) and disconnect the call when recording in Use State. It also stops recording when the other party hangs up the call.

 Recording conversation is disabled while you are in Analogue Service area.

Note: Your phone can store a total of four memos for 18 seconds each.

- 3. Highlight Voice Memo and press
- Press Memo (right softkey) for the shortcut (steps 1 to 3 above).

- You can change the message playing speed by pressing Slow (left softkey) or Fast (right softkey).

Tip: Voice Memo is stored with the date and time stamp in reverse chronological order, except when it's recorded in no service or analogue area.

Setting Up Screen Call

This feature enables you to answer incoming calls by using prerecorded announcements, either one that is pre-recorded or one that you record. You can also record the caller's message into the Voice Memo list. To listen to the message, see "Reviewing Voice Memos "on page 85.

Activating Screen Call

To start Screen Call when you have incoming calls:

- **1**. Press **MENU** to display the options.
- 2. Highlight Screen Call and press ().

To set Auto Screen Call:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight Screen Call and press (1987).
- 4. Highlight Auto and press Mere.
- 5. Highlight **On** and press **MEN**.
- If you want to change the answer time, enter your desired number (from 1 to 16 seconds) by using numeric keys or the up/down Navigation key.
- **6.** Press **C** or **O** (left softkey). The **C** icon is displayed on the Standby display.

Tip: If a new caller's message is waiting, $\textcircled{\bullet}$ appears on the display. The memos recorded while activating "Screen Call" are shown with " $\sqrt{"}$ or "!" icon in the list. (" $\sqrt{"}$: once played, "!": not played yet)

Tip: While the caller is recording: Pressing (100) stops recording and disconnects the call. Pressing (1414) answers the call.

10. Camera

Taking Pictures

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a key. You can activate Camera mode and take pictures whether the phone is open or closed.

To Take a Picture With the Phone Open:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press (1987) to access the Pictures menu.
- **3.** Highlight **Camera** and press **Camera** to activate Camera mode. (Additional user options are available through the Camera mode **Options** menu. See "Camera Mode Options" on page 92 for more information.)

Shortcut: To activate Camera mode in another way, press and hold (), press () twice, or just press the Side Camera key (see diagram on page 2).

- **4.** Using the phone's Main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
- 5. Hold the camera steady. To take the picture, press (1997),
- **6.** Press Keep (left softkey) to save the picture. Press Discard (right softkey) to erase the picture and return to Camera mode.
- Once you have kept/saved a picture, you will be in Review/Share mode. You will now be able to share or upload the picture.
- ► To return to Camera mode to take another picture, press .

To Take a Picture With the Phone Closed:

- **1.** Press and hold the Side Camera key to activate Camera mode.
- **2.** Point the camera lens at your subject. You can check the picture framing through the Sub LCD.

Note: When taking a picture with the phone closed, the subject image appears in reverse on the Sub LCD. When you take a picture, it will be saved correctly, that is, not reversed.

3. Press the Side Camera key to take the picture.

4. Press the Side Camera key to save the picture.

Note: The picture will be saved automatically after 30 seconds.

Note: While you are taking a picture, the backlight turns on even if your backlight is set to **Always Off**.

Note: In some cases, the screen may flicker and the stripes may appear on the display under fluorescent lighting.

Creating Your Picture Messaging Password

The first time you use any of the Picture Messaging management options involving the Picture Messaging website you will need to establish a Picture Messaging password through your phone. This password will also allow you to log in to the Picture Messaging website at <u>www.bell.ca/mypictures</u> to access and manage your uploaded pictures.

To create your Picture Messaging password:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Pictures and press
- 3. Highlight **Review/Share** and press .

Shortcut: Instead of steps 3 above, highlight **Camera** and press **(WRP)**. Then press **Review** (left softkey) to enter Review/Share mode.

- 4. Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Upload**, and press **ER**.
- 5. Highlight **Upload This** or **Upload All** and press (R). You will be prompted to create a Picture Messaging password.

Note: To access Picture Messaging website in another way, highlight **Online Pics** and press **INP** from step 3 above.

6. Enter a 4-digit, alpha-numeric password and press .

Tip: Write down your Picture Messaging password in a secure place.

7. Please wait while the system creates your account.

Once you have received confirmation that your account has been successfully registered you may upload and share pictures and access the Picture Messaging website.

Camera Mode Options

When the phone is open and in Camera mode, several user options are available.

Review: Press Review (left softkey) to enter Review/Share mode. From there you can view the captured pictures, view a running count of stored pictures, and more. (See "Review/Share Mode" on page 96.)


Pressing **Options** (right softkey) displays additional user options:

- ► **Self-timer:** Activate the camera's timer function. (See "Setting Self-timer" on the next page for details.)
- ► **Fun Frames:** Select your favourite fun picture frame to decorate your picture and press .
- ► Colour Tone: Select Normal, Sepia, Black & White or Negative. (Default setting is Normal.)
- Brightness: Select Auto or Manual brightness control. If you select Manual, press the Navigation key right (Higher) or left (Lower) to select a setting and press (SC) or OK (left softkey) to apply the desired setting. (Default setting is Auto.)
- ► Shutter Sound: Select Default, Say "Cheez" or Off. If your phone's ringer is set to Silence All, Shutter Sound is set to Off.

Tip: You can also select fun frames from Camera mode by using the left/right Navigation key.

Note: After taking a picture, **Self-timer** and **Fun Frames** settings return to their default settings.

Note: Press the up or down Navigation key to display a picture count at the bottom of the Main LCD. On the same line of the LCD display, appears if you set a **Colour Tone** and appears if you set a **Brightness**.



Setting Self-timer

To activate the Self-timer and get yourself in on the picture:

- **1.** With the phone open and in Camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Self-timer and press
- 3. Highlight the length of delay you want the timer to use (10 seconds or 5 seconds) and press (10 seconds). To deactivate the Self-timer, highlight Off and press (10 seconds).
- 4. Press Start (left softkey) when you are ready to start the timer.
 i) and a numeric countdown appear on the lower left portion of the Main LCD during the Self-timer countdown.
- **5.** Get ready for the picture. When the timer is down to three seconds, the Self-timer icon will turn red and the phone will begin to beep.
- ► To cancel the Self-timer after it has started, press **Cancel** (right softkey).

Note: While the Self-timer is active, all keys are disabled except (BACK) (RDIO) or Cancel (right softkey).

Tip: To view a brief summary of Camera, Review/Share, and Picture Wallet use, press **Info** (right softkey) from the Pictures main menu.

Sharing Picture Messaging

Once you've taken a picture, you instantly share it with family and friends. You can send a picture to up to ten people at a time using their email addresses or phone numbers. (You can also share pictures through your online album. See "Sharing Online Picture Messaging" on page 101 for details.)

Sharing Picture Messaging from Review/Share Mode

- **1.** From standby mode, press (MRP) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press **W** to display the Pictures menu.

Shortcut: Instead of steps 1 and 2 above, press (2).

- 3. Highlight **Review/Share** to enter Review/Share mode.
- **4.** From Review/Share mode, use your Navigation key to select the picture you'd like to send and press **Share** (left softkey).

Note: The first time you share Picture Messaging, you will be prompted to establish a Picture Messaging password. See "Creating Your Picture Messaging Password" on page 91 for information.

- 5. Select From Phone Book, Mobile Phone#, or Email Address to enter recipients.
- ► From Phone Book to select a recipient from your Phone Book. Press ♥♥♥ to select. Or select <New Entry> to enter a new entry.
- Mobile Phone# to enter a mobile phone number directly.
- **Email Address** to enter an email address directly.
- 6. To add a recipient, press **Options** (right softkey), press **Add Recipients**, and press **MR**.
- **Edit** to edit the selected entry.
- **Erase** to erase the selected entry.
- **Erase All** to erase all entries you have selected/entered.
- Add Recipient to add recipients.
- **Exit** to exit the options menu.

Note: If there are no entries in your Phone Book, a blank New Entry form will display.

Note: The $\boxed{\mathbf{M}}$ and $\boxed{@}$ icons next to entry's names represent Mobile Phone and email. When entering a new entry, use the left/right Navigation key to toggle to the correct icon for the entry.

Note: Only the email address or the phone number may be selected for a recipient. To change the default once the new entry has been added, use the Navigation key and scroll right to select either

(mobile phone number) or (a) (email address).

- **7.** Press Next (left softkey) when you are finished selecting/entering recipients (you may include up to 10 recipients per Picture Messaging).
- 8. To record and include a Voice Memo with the picture you are sending, highlight **Include**, press (R), and start recording after the beep. (Maximum recording time is 10 seconds.) Press (R) to end the recording.

- or -

If you do not wish to attach a Voice Memo to the Picture Messaging, highlight **Don't Include** and press **(BR)**.

- 9. Use your keypad to enter a text message (or press the right softkey to select from **Canned Messages** or **Recent Messages**) and press (RC). (You may also choose to leave the message area blank; just press (RC) to continue.)
- **10.** Confirm the recipients, message, voice memo, and picture.
- ► To change a recipient, highlight the recipient, press Change (right softkey), and follow the instructions in step 5 above to select a recipient or to edit the selected recipient.
- ► To change or confirm other items, highlight the box beneath Message and press **Options** (right softkey) to display options:

Message Change to enter or change the text message.

VoiceMemo Play to play the attached Voice Memo (if applicable).

VoiceMemo Rec to record or re-record the Voice Memo.

VoiceMemo Erase to delete the Voice Memo from the Picture Messaging (if applicable).

11. Press **Send** (left softkey) to send the Picture Messaging.

Sharing Picture Messaging from Messaging

You can also share your pictures from your phone's Messaging menu.

- **1.** Press **(MRV)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Messaging** and press **Mere**.

Shortcut: Press the up Navigation key to enter Messaging menu.

- 3. Highlight Send Message and press (1987).
- 4. Highlight **Picture** and press **Mere**.
- **5.** Use your Navigation key to select the picture you wish to send and press **Select** (left softkey).
- **6.** To complete and send the Picture Messaging, follow steps 5-11 in "Sharing Picture Messaging from Review/Share Mode" on page 94.

Storing Pictures

Your phone can store pictures in two ways:

- Review/Share Mode (see below)
- Picture Wallet (see page 98)

Review/Share Mode

When a picture is taken and kept, it is saved to Review/Share mode. You can enter Review/Share mode from the Pictures menu by selecting **Review/Share**. You may also enter Review/Share mode from Camera mode by pressing **Review** (left softkey). (When you take a picture and press **Keep** (left softkey), your phone automatically enters Review/Share mode.) In Review/Share mode, you can view all the pictures you have kept, store selected images in your phone, send pictures to the Picture Messaging website, delete pictures and access additional picture options. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the following options:

- **Camera** to switch to Camera mode.
- Save to Wallet to save a picture to the Picture Wallet. (See "Picture Wallet" on the next page.)
- ▶ Upload to select Upload This or Upload All to upload a single picture or all pictures saved in Review/Share mode to the Picture Messaging website.

Note: Depending on your settings, the uploaded pictures will be deleted automatically from your phone. See page 103 for setting this feature.

Note: If this is the first time you have accessed the Picture Messaging account, you will be prompted to create your Picture Messaging password. See "Creating Your Picture Messaging Password" on page 91.

▶ Erase to select Erase This or Erase All to erase a single picture or all pictures saved in Review/Share mode.


Note: Erasing pictures will free up memory space in your phone to enable you to take more pictures. Once erased, pictures cannot be uploaded to your online Picture Messaging account or saved to the Picture Wallet.

Colour Tone to select a colour tone (Sepia, Black & White, or Negative) for the picture.

Note: Once you have changed a picture's colour tone, it cannot be returned to its original tone.

- Edit Caption to edit the picture's caption. (Up to 14 characters. See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 50.)
- **Picture Info** to display information on the selected picture, such as caption, time/date, size, etc.
- **Expand** to switch the display from thumbnail view (up to four pictures per screen) to full-screen view. (If the display is already in full-screen view, the option will appear as **Thumbnail** to switch from full-screen to thumbnail view.)

Tip: In expanded view, press the up or down Navigation key to view a picture's caption and number/count (for example 1/10 is the first of 10 stored pictures) at the bottom of the display screen. The Save to Wallet and Uploaded III icons also appear, if applicable.



Picture Wallet

Your phone can store up to 60 pictures in the Picture Wallet, depending on available memory.

To save a picture to the Picture Wallet:


- **1.** From Review/Share mode (see "Review/Share Mode" on page 96), use your Navigation key to select a picture you wish to save the Picture Wallet.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey). The Review/Share mode options will display.
- **3.** Highlight **Save to Wallet** and press **CRP**. A copy of the picture will be saved to the Picture Wallet.

To view pictures stored in the Picture Wallet:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press
- 3. Highlight **Picture Wallet** and press (1989).
- 4. Using the Navigation key, select a desired picture.
- **5.** To expand the selected picture, press **Expand** (left softkey).
- **6.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display a list of options for the selected picture. To select an option, highlight it and press
- ► Incoming Calls to display the selected picture for all incoming calls.
- **Screen Saver** to display the picture as an LCD screen saver.
- Phone Book to display the picture for incoming calls from a specific internal phone book entry.
- ► Erase select Erase This or Erase All to erase the selected picture or all pictures saved in the Picture Wallet.

Note: Pictures may be assigned to more than one task.

Note: Press the up/down Navigation key to view a picture's file name and picture count at the bottom of the display screen. The Assigned A icon also appears, if applicable.



Managing Picture Messaging

Using the Picture Messaging Website

Once you have uploaded pictures from your phone to your online Picture Messaging account (see "Review/Share Mode" on page 96), you can use your personal computer to manage your pictures. From the Picture Messaging website you can share pictures, edit album titles and picture captions, organize and move images, and do much more.

To access the Picture Messaging Website:

- From your computer's Internet connection, go to <u>www.bell.ca/mypictures</u>.
- **2.** Enter your phone number and Picture Messaging password to register. (See "Creating Your Picture Messaging Password" on page 91.)

Managing Online Picture Messaging From Your Phone

You can use your phone to manage, edit, or share pictures you have uploaded to the Picture Messaging website. (See "Review/Share Mode" on page 96 for information about uploading.)

To view your online Picture Messaging from your Phone:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press .
- 3. Highlight **Online Pics** and press **MRP**.
- 4. Your Picture Messaging InBox and your albums appear. Highlight **InBox** or an album title and press IPP to display.
- **5.** Thumbnail pictures appear (up to four per screen). Use your Navigation key to select a picture.

Tip: To expand a selected picture from thumbnail to full-screen, highlight it and press **()**.

Sharing Online Picture Messaging

- 1. From the online Picture Messaging InBox, select a picture you wish to share and press Share (left softkey).
- 2. Highlight Phone Book or Online Addr. Book and press
- **3.** Select a recipient from your Internal Phone Book or Online Address Book, and press **MEW**.

Options (Online Address Book only):

- Next to display the next 50 entries (if applicable).
- **Previous** to display the previous 50 entries (if applicable).
- **Exit** to exit the options menu.
- To complete and send the Picture Messaging, follow steps 5-10 in "Sharing Picture Messaging from Review/Share Mode" on page 96.

To share an album from online mode:

- 1. From the online Albums display, use the Navigation key to select an album you wish to share and press **Share** (left softkey).
- **2.** Follow steps 2-4 in "Sharing Online Picture Messaging" to complete and send your Picture Messaging.
- > You cannot attach Voice Memo when you share an album.

Accessing Online Picture Messaging Options From Your Phone

- **1.** Select a picture from your online Picture Messaging (see "Managing Online Picture Messaging From Your Phone" on page 100).
- **2**. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display options.
- 3. To select an option, highlight it and press (MRW).
- Copy/Move to copy or move pictures to a selected album:
 Copy This to copy the selected picture to the album.
 Copy All to copy all pictures in the current album (or InBox) to the target album.
 - **Move This** to move the selected picture to the album. **Move All** to move all pictures in the current album (or InBox) to the target album.
- Save to Wallet to copy the selected picture to the Picture Wallet. (See "Picture Wallet" on page 98.)
- Erase to select Erase This or Erase All to erase a single picture or all pictures saved in the current album (or InBox).
- **Edit Caption** to edit the picture's caption.
- Picture Info to display information on the selected picture, such as caption, time/date, size, etc.
- Rotate Picture to rotate the selected picture. After selecting Rotate Picture, you can rotate the selected picture by pressing
 Image: Arrow of the Navigation key, or Rotate (right softkey).
- ► **Create Album** to create a new album (from the InBox only). Enter the album name and press **Save** (left softkey).
- Online Albums to switch from pictures to the album list.
- ► **Thumbnail** to switch a selected picture from thumbnail to full-screen. (If the display is already in Thumbnail view, the option will appear as **Expand**.)
- Next to display the next 20 pictures (if applicable).
- ▶ **Previous** to display the previous 20 pictures (if applicable).

To access your online Albums options from your Phone:

- Display the album list in the online Picture Messaging menu. (See "Managing Online Picture Messaging From Your Phone" on page 100).
- **2**. Use your Navigation key to select an album (or InBox).
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display options.
- 4. To select an option, highlight it and press (MRW).
- Create Album to create a new album. Enter a new album name and press Save (left softkey).
- **Erase Album** to delete the selected album.
- Rename Album to rename the selected album. Enter a new name and press Save (left softkey).

Note: The InBox cannot be erased or renamed.

- Album Info to display information on the selected album; name, time/date and number of saved pictures.
- Next to display the next 20 albums (if applicable).
- ▶ **Previous** to display the previous 20 albums (if applicable).

Setting Auto Delete Function

With this feature, pictures which have been uploaded to your online Picture Messaging account will be erased automatically from your phone's Review/Share mode.

To set Auto Delete function:

- **1**. Press **MEN** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Pictures and Mer.
- 3. Highlight Setting and press .
- 4. Select **Yes** and press **WERD** to activate auto delete function.
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **No** during step 4.

11. Messaging

New Messages

When you receive a new Message or Web Alert, your phone will alert you. Press View (left softkey) to display the message details.

- Press Call (left softkey) to dial the phone number. (Appears when a phone number is highlighted.)
- Press Reply (left softkey) to reply the message. (Appears when a phone number or email address is highlighted.)
- Press Go (left softkey) to go to the website. (Appears when a URL is highlighted.)
- Press Forward (left softkey) to forward the message. (Appears only if there are no phone numbers and URLs in the message.)
- Press Options (right softkey) to display options. (See page 109 for details.)

Tip: When you highlight a phone number, the left softkey may change as **Call** or **Reply** depending on the circumstances.

Note: Web Alert is a URL. When you buy a ringer or image through your computer for your phone, your phone will receive a Web Alert. You will also receive a Web Alert when you receive Picture Messaging. Press **Go** (left softkey) to go to the website.

Message Storage

Your phone can store up to 200 received Messages, 180 sent Messages, and 20 Web Alerts. When the message memory is full, the oldest unlocked message will be deleted automatically (see page 110 for locking the message).

Displaying Messages

To display a Message from the message notification alert, see "New Messages" on the previous page.

To display a Message from the main menu:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press ().
- 3. Highlight Text Msg and press (The folder list appears.)
- 4. Highlight Inbox, Sent, Outbox, Drafts, or your defined folder and press (R. (The message list appears.)
- **5.** Highlight the header of the message you want to see and press (MRP). (The message detail appears.)

To display a Web Alert:

- **1**. Press **()** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press (1989).
- **3.** Highlight **Web Alerts** and press **W**. (The Web Alerts list appears.)
- 4. Highlight the header of the message you want to see and press (R.). (The Web Alert detail appears.)

- 4. Highlight Text Message and press
- 5. Highlight From Phone Book, Mobile Phone#, or Email Address to enter recipients.
- From Phone Book to select a recipient from your Phone Book. Press To select. Or select <New Entry> to enter a new entry.
- Mobile Phone# to enter a mobile phone number directly.
- **Email Address** to enter an email address directly.

- 6. To add a recipient, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Add Recipients**, and press **Options**.
- **Edit** to edit the selected entry.
- **Erase** to erase the selected entry.
- **Erase All** to erase all entries you have selected/entered.
- Add Recipient to add recipients.
- **Exit** to exit the options menu.
- 7. Press Next (left softkey) when you are finished selecting/entering recipients (you may include up to 10 recipients).
- 8. To enter a message, select the box under Message and press
- **9.** Use your keypad to enter a text message (or press the right softkey to select from **Canned Messages** or **Recent Messages**) and press **EXP**.
- **10.** To set the message priority, select the box under Priority and press **NEW**.
- 11. Highlight **Ordinary** or **Urgent** and press **ERP**.
- **12.** Press **Send** (left softkey) to send the message.

To change the recipients or to save the message as a draft, press **Options** (right softkey) and select **Chg Recipients** or **Save to Drafts** during steps 8-12 above.

- Chg Recipients to change Recipients.
- Save to Drafts to save the message to a Drafts folder. (See next page to edit and send the draft message.)

Note: If there is a failure when sending a message, the message goes to the Outbox folder. See next page to send the message.

Sending a Message in the Drafts Folder

To edit and send a message in the drafts folder:

- **1**. Press **(MERC)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Messaging** and press .
- 3. Highlight **Text Msg** and press **ERP**.
- 4. Highlight **Drafts** and press
- **5.** Highlight the message you wish to edit and press **Options** (right softkey).
- **Edit** to edit the draft message.
- **Send** to send the draft message.
- Compose New to compose a new message.
- **Erase** to erase the message.
- **Erase All** to erase all messages in the drafts folder.
- 6. Highlight **Edit** and press (1987) to edit the message.
- **7.** After editing the message press **Send** (left softkey) to send the message.

Tip: The oldest message in the drafts folder will be erased when you save more than 10 messages.

Sending a Message in the Outbox Folder

If a failure occurs when you try to send a message, the message goes to the Outbox folder.

- 1. Press (to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight **Text Msg** and press **MERU**.
- 4. Highlight **Outbox** and press .
- **5.** Highlight the message you wish to send, and press **Send** (left softkey).

Message Options

Several options are available when you display a folder list, message list, or message details.

Folder List Options

Highlight **Inbox**, **Sent**, **Outbox**, **Drafts**, or your defined folder and press **Options** (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press **UPP**.

- **Edit Folder** to edit the folder (user defined folder only).
- **Erase Folder** to erase the folder (user defined folder only).
- **Create Folder** to create a new user defined folder.
- **Compose New** to compose a new message.
- **Erase Messages** to erase messages (if applicable).

Message List Options

To display message list options, highlight **Inbox** (or defined folder), **Sent**, **Outbox**, or **Drafts** and press **(RP)**. Then press **(Dptions)** (right softkey).

- **Reply** to reply to the message. (See page 106 to send a message.) (Inbox only.)
- ► Forward to forward the message. Select from From Phone Book, Mobile Phone#, or Email Address. (Inbox and Sent only.)
- **Edit** to edit a message. (Outbox and Drafts only.)
- **Send** to send a message. (Outbox and Drafts only.)
- ▶ Move to move a message to the Inbox or to your defined folder. Select a folder and press (, or press < New Folder> to create a new folder. (See page 112 to create a folder.) (Inbox only.)
- ► Lock to lock a message. Locked messages will not be erased automatically. To unlock the message, select Unlock and press . (Inbox and Sent only.)
- **Compose New** to compose a new message. (See page 106 to compose a new message.)
- **Erase** to erase the selected message.
- **Erase Read Msgs** to erase read messages in the folder (except locked messages). (Inbox only.)

Erase All to erase all messages in the folder (except locked messages). A warning message appears if there are unread messages.

Tip: You can lock up to 40 messages. Locked messages will be displayed with 2.

Messages Details Options

After you display the Message list in the Inbox, Sent, or your defined folder, press to display the message details. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display message options. To select an option, highlight it and press **EXP**.

- ► Call(Go to List) to call a number in the message. Select a number and press (Call (left softkey) to make a call.
- **Prefix** to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number (if applicable).
- ► **Go to URL List** to display URLs in the message. Press **Go** (left softkey) or select a URL and press **C** to go to the site.
- Send Message to display phone numbers and email addresses to send a message. (See page 106 for details.)
- Reply to reply to the message. (See page 106 to send a message.) (Message in Inbox and defined folder only.)
- ► Forward to forward the message. Select from From Phone Book, Mobile Phone#, or Email Address.
- ► Move to move the message to another folder. Select a folder and press () or press (New Folder > to create a new folder. (See page 112 to create a folder.) (Message in Inbox and defined folder only.)
- Lock to lock the message. Locked messages will not be erased automatically. To unlock the message, select Unlock and press (NR).
- **Font Size** to change the font size from **Small** or **Normal**.
- ► Save to Ph. Book to save the phone number, email address and URLs. Select a data category and press (NR) to save.
- Go to Phone Book to go to the Phone Book (if applicable).
- **Compose New** to compose a new message. (See page 106 to compose a message.)
- **Erase** to erase the message.

Changing the Display Font Size of a Message

After you display a Message in the Inbox, Sent, or your defined folder, press **Options** (right softkey) to display message options.

1. Highlight Font Size and press (1).

2. Highlight Small or Normal and press (SW).

Prefixing a Phone Number From a Message

After you display a Message in the Inbox, Sent, or your defined folder, press **Options** (right softkey) to display message options.

If you happen to be outside your local area code and need to add a prefix to a phone number:

- 1. Highlight **Prefix** and press (1).
- 2. Press (See below) you want to add to the number. If you want to save the number, press and select the **Save Phone#** option. If not, the changes only apply to the current call.
- 3. To select an option, press (MR), highlight it and press (MR).
- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- **Save Phone**# to store the phone number in your Phone Book.
- ► **Hard Pause** to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialling and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)
- ► **12-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialling and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)

Creating Folders for Messages

You can create up to ten folders to store your Messages. When 10 user defined folders exist, the "Create Folder" option will not appear.

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Messaging** and press .
- 3. Highlight **Text Msg** and press **MRP**.
- **4.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Create Folder** and press (SPP).
- 6. Enter a folder name and press ((left softkey)).
- Pressing Save (left softkey) allows you to save the folder name.
- 7. If you want the message to be filed into the folder automatically, highlight the menu under **Auto Filing** and press **CRP**.
- 8. Highlight **On** and press **MERU**.
- **9.** Highlight the box under **Keyword** by scrolling down and press
- **10.** Enter a keyword and press **(I)** or **OK** (left softkey).
- 11. Press Save (left softkey).

To set an optional feature for the added folder:

- 1. During step 9 above, scroll down to select other menu options. Highlight the menu under each item and press (MEW).
- ► **Notify** to set the display notification to on or off when you have unread message matching the defined folder.
- **Envelope lcon** to set the envelope icon display to on or off when you have unread message matching the defined folder.
- 2. After selecting each setting, press Save (left softkey).

Moving a Message Into Another Folder

After you display a message, press **Options** (right softkey) to display message options. You need at least one defined folder. (Inbox or user defined folder only.)

- 1. Highlight **Move** and press (Merce).
- 2. Highlight your desired folder and press ().

Editing Folders

- **1.** From the folder list display, highlight a defined folder.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight Edit Folder and press ().
- 4. Highlight the box under your desired option and press ().
- 5. Enter or select a new folder name/setting.
- 6. Press or **OK** (left softkey).
- 7. Press Save (left softkey).

Erasing a Folder

- **1.** From the folder list display, highlight the defined folder you want to erase.
- **2**. Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Erase Folder** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight Yes and press .

Note: When you erase a folder, the messages within the folder are also erased. If the folder contains a new (unread) message or locked message, you are prompted to select **Erase** or **Don't Erase**.

Erasing Selected Messages in All Folders

- **1.** From the folder list display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Erase Messages and press
- **3.** Select **Read**, **Unread**, and/or **Sent** and press **W** to check the appropriate box(es).
- **4**. After selecting the boxes, press **Done** (left softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Erase** and press **EXE** to erase selected messages (except locked messages).

Note: To erase an individual message, see "Message Options" on page 109.

Web Alerts Options

Several options are also available for Web Alerts.

Web Alerts List Options

From Messaging display, highlight **Web Alerts**, press **Options** (right softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press **Options**.

- Lock to lock a message. Locked messages will not be erased automatically. To unlock the messages, select Unlock and press OFF.
- **Erase** to erase the messages.
- **Erase Read Msgs** to erase read messages in the folder (except locked messages).
- **Erase All** to erase all messages in the folder (except locked messages). A warning message appears if there are unread messages.

Tip: You can lock up to 10 messages. Locked messages will be displayed with 📳.

Web Alerts Details Options

After you display the Web Alerts list, press () to display the Web Alerts details. Press () (right softkey) to display Web Alerts options. To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- **Go to URL** to go to the website.
- Lock to lock a message. Locked messages will not be erased automatically. To unlock the messages, select Unlock and press URD.
- **Font Size** to change the font size from **Small** or **Normal**.
- **Erase** to erase the message.

12. Service Features

Using Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you to new voicemail messages:

- By displaying a message on the screen.
- By playing the assigned ringer type.
- ▶ By blinking the LED.
- ▶ By displaying 🖾 at the top of your screen.

Displaying Voicemail Details

- **1**. Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- **2.** Highlight **Voicemail** and press **MEN**.
- 3. Highlight **Details** and press **MRP**.

Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages

1. Press and hold **1**. Follow the system prompts.

- or -

- **1**. Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voicemail and press Mere.
- 3. Highlight Call Voicemail and press

Clearing the Message Icon

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- **2**. Highlight **Voicemail** and press **MEN**.
- 3. Highlight **Clear Count** and press .
- 4. Highlight **Yes** and press **MRP**.

Editing Your Voicemail Number

To edit your voicemail number:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voicemail and press .
- 3. Highlight Edit Voicemail# and press (SEP).
- 4. Edit your voicemail number and press (
- To reset your voicemail number:
- **1.** Follow steps 1 to 3 above.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Reset Voicemail#** and press
- 4. Highlight **Yes** and press (MR).

Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- Press (or press), highlight Flash and press). This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.
- ► To switch back to the first caller, press TALK (or press (), highlight **Flash** and press () again.

Note: Call Waiting may not be available while roaming off the home network.

Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press TALK.
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press (or press (), highlight Three-Way Call and press () to put the first caller on hold.
- 3. Enter the second number you wish to call and press (or press (), highlight Call and press ()).
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press (TALK) again (or press (TALK), highlight Flash and press (TALK)) to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Internal Phone Book, Call History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press **CRP** during step 3 above.

Web

With Web on your phone, you will be able to browse full-colour graphic versions – not just text versions – of your favourite website, making it easier than ever to stay informed while on the go. Check sports scores, trade stocks, and shop all on your phone.

Launching the Web

To launch the Web:

1. Press Web (left softkey).

- or -

- 1. Press (to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Web and press .

Net Guard

With the Net Guard setting, the confirmation display will appear to connect to the Internet. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting **Always Auto-Connect** when the Net Guard is displayed.

To change your Net Guard settings:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Internet and press ().
- 4. Highlight Net Guard and press ().
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** and press **MENU**.
- **On** to make the Net Guard appear when connecting to the Internet.
- **Off** to avoid the Net Guard when connecting to the Internet.

Note: When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once per session. The Net Guard does not appear if the phone is merely re-connecting due to a time-out.

Browsing the Web

Going to a Specific Website

To go to a particular website by entering a URL (website address):

- 1. Launch the Web and press the right softkey.
- 2. Select Go to URL... and press the left softkey.
- **3.** Select **Address** and press the left softkey.
- **4.** Press the right softkey, use your keypad to enter the URL of the website you wish to go to, and press the left softkey.
- 5. Press the left softkey to go to the website.

Note: Not all website are viewable on your phone.

Creating a Bookmark

Bookmarks allow you to store the address of your favourite website for easy access at a later time.

To create a bookmark:

- 1. Launch the Web page you want to mark.
- **2**. Press the right softkey to go to the Browser menu.
- 3. Select Mark this page and press the left softkey.

Note: Bookmarking a page does not store the page contents, just its address.

Note: Some pages cannot be bookmarked. Whether a particular Web page may be marked is controlled by its creator.

Accessing a Bookmark

To access a bookmark:

- **1.** Launch the Web and press the right softkey.
- 2. Select **Browser Menu** and press the left softkey.
- **3**. Select **View Bookmarks** and press the left softkey.
- 4. Highlight the bookmark you'd like to access and press the left softkey button or www to go to the website.

Editing a Bookmark

- **1.** Launch the Web and press the right softkey.
- 2. Select View Bookmarks and press the left softkey.
- **3.** Select the bookmark you wish to edit and press the right softkey.
- 4. Select Edit Address or Edit Title, and press the left softkey.
- **5.** Press the right softkey, use your keypad to edit the address or title, and press the left softkey.
- 6. To save the bookmark, press the left softkey.

Deleting a Bookmark

- 1. Launch the Web and press the right softkey.
- 2. Select View Bookmarks and press the left softkey.
- **3.** Highlight the bookmark you wish to erase and press the right softkey.
- 4. Select **Delete** and press the left softkey.
- **5**. Press the right softkey.
- ► If you want to delete all bookmarks, select **Delete All** during step 4 above.

Reloading a Web Page

- 1. Launch the Web.
- 2. To reload (refresh) the current Web page, press the right softkey.
- 3. Select Browser Menu and press the left softkey.
- 4. Select Refresh this page and press the left softkey.

Restarting the Web Browser

If the Web browser appears to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

- 1. Launch the Web.
- **2**. To restart the Web browser, press the right softkey.
- 3. Select Browser Menu and press the left softkey.
- 4. Select More... and press the left softkey.
- 5. Select **Restart Browser** and press the left softkey.

Games

Downloading Games

- **1**. Press **()** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight **Games** and press **MRP**.
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press (CRP). The browser will launch and take you to the Games download menu.
- **5.** Use your Navigation key to highlight and select a game you wish to download.
- 6. Follow the system prompts to download.

Playing Games

To play a downloaded game on your phone:

- **1**. Press **()** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press (1987).
- 3. Highlight **Games** and press **MEND**.
- 4. Select the game you wish to play.
- **5.** If applicable, a prompt will display the days remaining on the game license and ask if you want to continue. Select **Yes**.
- **6.** Follow the onscreen instructions to play the game. When you are finished, press **ENDIO**.
- **7.** A prompt will display: "Resume the Application?" Select **Yes** to continue playing or **No** to exit.

Ringers

Downloading Ringers

To download an available ringer to your phone:

- **1.** Press **Meru** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight **Ringers** and press .
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press (EXP). The browser will launch and take you to the Ringers download menu.
- **5.** Use your Navigation key to highlight and select a ringer you wish to download.
- 6. Follow the system prompts to download.

Note: You may store total of 512KB downloaded data on your phone.

Assigning Downloaded Ringers

Downloaded ringers may be assigned directly from the Downloads menu and are also available through the Settings menu.

To assign a downloaded ringer through the Settings menu, see "Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls" on page 17, "Selecting Ringer Types for Voicemail" on page 17, "Selecting Ringer Types for Messages" on page 18, "Selecting Ringer Types for Calendar" on page 18, "Setting a Start-up/Power-off Tone" on page 19 or "Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry" on page 59.

To assign a downloaded ringer from the Downloads menu:

- **1**. Press **(MERU)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press (SP).
- 3. Highlight **Ringers** and press **EXP**.
- 4. Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press ().
- 5. Select Assign from the options and press ().
- 6. Highlight Voice Calls, Voicemail, Messaging, Calendar, Start-up Tone, Power-off Tone, or Phone Book, and press IPP. The following two items require an extra step:
- ► Voice Calls: highlight With Caller ID or No Caller ID, and press (NR).
- 7. A message appears confirming the data has been assigned.

Note: You may assign a ringer to more than one type of call.

Screen Savers

Downloading Screen Savers (Images)

To download an available Screen Saver (Image) to your phone:

- **1**. Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Screen Savers and press ().
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press (Section 2010). The browser will launch and take you to the Screen Savers download menu.
- **5.** Use your Navigation key to highlight and select a Screen Saver you wish to download.
- 6. Follow the system prompts to download.

Note: You may store total of 512KB downloaded data on your phone, depending on the file sizes.

Assigning Downloaded Screen Savers (Images)

Downloaded Screen Savers may be assigned directly from the Downloads menu and are also available through the Settings menu.

To assign a downloaded Screen Saver through the Settings menu, see "Changing the Display Screen" on page 25, "Changing the Display for Incoming Calls" on page 26, "Changing the Screen Saver" on page 28 or "Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry" on page 59.

To assign a downloaded Screen Saver from the Downloads menu:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press ().
- 3. Highlight Screen Savers and press (Serve).
- **4.** Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press **MEW**.
- 5. Select Assign from the options and press ().
- 6. Highlight one of Incoming Calls, Screen Saver or Phone Book, Standby, Outgoing Calls, or Service Search, and press (). The following item needs an extra step:
- 7. A message appears confirming the data has been assigned.

Note: Depending on the data, you can select where to assign the data: Image data: **Incoming Calls, Screen Saver**, or **Phone Book**. Animation data: **Standby, Outgoing Calls**, or **Service Search**.

Note: You may assign a Screen Saver to more than one task.
