





- Source selector:
 BAND (MW/FM), CD, TAPE/OFF- to select source of sound/radio waveband, and also the power OFF switch
- ② INCREDIBLE SURROUND To create a phenomenal surround sound stereo effect


Batteries

Whenever convenient, use the mains supply if you want to conserve battery life. The battery supply will be switched off when the set is connected to the mains.

Batteries (optional)


- Open the battery compartment and insert six batteries, type R20, UM1 or D-cells (preferably alkaline) with the correct polarity as indicated by the (+) and (-) symbols inside the compartment.
- Replace the compartment door, making sure the batteries are firmly and correctly in place. The set is now ready to operate.
- 3. Remove the batteries if the set is not to be used for a long time.
- Incorrect use of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage and will corrode the compartment or cause the batteries to burst.
 Therefore:
 - Do not mix battery types, e.g. alkaline with carbon zinc.
 Only use batteries of the same type for the set.
 - When inserting new batteries, do not try to mix old batteries with the new ones.

Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly



AC MAINS

- Check if the mains voltage as shown on the type plate on the base of the set, corresponds to your local mains voltage. If it does not, consult your dealer or service organisation.
- If your set is equipped with a voltage selector, adjust it so that it matches with the local mains.
- Connect the mains lead to the MAINS socket and the wall socket.
 - → The mains supply is now connected and ready for use.
- To switch off completely, withdraw the mains lead from the wall socket.
- Disconnect the mains lead from the wall socket to protect your set during heavy thunderstorms.
- To avoid overheating of the set a safety circuit has been built in. Therefore your set may disconnect under extreme conditions. If this happens, switch the set off and let it cool down before reusing it.



Environmental information

All unnecessary packaging material has been omitted. We have done our utmost to make the packaging easily separable into three mono materials: cardboard, polystyrene and plastic.

Your set consists of materials which can be recycled if disassembled by a specialized company. Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of packaging materials, exhausted batteries and old equipment.

RADIO RECEPTION

- 1. To select the desired station waveband, set the source selector to (MW/FM).
- 2. Tune to a radio station using the tuning knob.
 - For FM, pull out the telescopic aerial.
 Incline and turn the aerial. Reduce its length if the signal is too strong (very close to a transmitter).
 - For MW, (AM) the set is provided with a built-in aerial so the telescopic aerial is not needed. Direct the aerial by turning the whole set.
- 3. Adjust the sound using the VOLUME, INCREDIBLE SURROUND and BASS controls.
- 4. To switch off the radio, adjust the source selector to the TAPE/OFF position (with the cassette keys released)




CD DISPLAY INDICATION

- Total track number: in stop mode
- Current track number: during CD play.
- SHUFFLE/REPEAT modes: when the respective mode is activated
- PROGRAM: When active. P also appears briefly when you store a track
- No: no disc
- E: error in CD operation or with the CD (see Troubleshooting)

SHUFFLE REPEAT ALL

PLAYING A CD

- 1. Set the source selector to CD
- To open the CD door, press OPEN on the CD door.
- Insert a CD with the printed side facing up and press the CD door gently to close.
 - → The CD player scans the contents of the CD and the total number of tracks is displayed.
- Press PLAY/PAUSE ➤II to start playback.
- Adjust the sound using the VOLUME, INCREDIBLE SURROUND and BASS controls.
- To interrupt playback press PLAY/PAUSE ►II. To resume, press PLAY ► again
 - → The current track number flashes in the display
- 7. To stop CD play, press STOP ■.
- To switch off the set, adjust the source selector to TAPE/OFF position (with the cassette keys released)



- the CD door is opened;
- the source selector is in MW/FM or TAPE/OFF position;
- the CD has reached to the end;



During playback, you can use the SEARCH keys to select a particular track.

Press SEARCH >> once for the next track, or press repeatedly
until the desired track number appears in the display.




2. If you have selected a track number in the stop or pause position, you will need to press PLAY/PAUSE ►II to start playback.

Finding a passage within a track

- 1. Press and hold down SEARCH * or >.
 - → The CD is played at high speed and low volume.
- **2.** When you recognize the passage you want, release the SEARCH button.







Different play modes: SHUFFLE/REPEAT

The **CD MODE** button allows you to select 4 different play modes. The modes can be selected or changed during playback.

1. During playback, select your play mode by pressing CD

MODE once or more until the desired play mode appears in the display.

SHUFFLE - All tracks or programme are played in random order

SHUFFLE REPEAT ALL - Repeats the entire CD or programme in random order.

REPEAT - Plays the current track continuously.

REPEAT ALL - repeats the entire CD or programme

- → You can use **SEARCH !**◄ or **>**> to skip tracks during CD MODE playback.
- To return to normal playback press CD MODE until the various SHUFFLE/ REPEAT modes are no longer shown in the display.
 - → You can also press **STOP** to quit the play mode.



PROGRAMMING TRACK NUMBERS

You may store up to 20 tracks in the desired sequence. If you like, store any track more than once.

- In the STOP position, press SEARCH

 or
 for your desired track.
- As soon as your chosen track number is displayed, press CD MODE once to store the track.
 - → The display will show 'P' briefly and 'PROGRAM', followed by your selected track number.
- 3. Select and store all desired tracks in this way.

To review your set programme

- In the stop position, press and hold down CD MODE for one second or more.
 - The display will show in sequence all your stored track numbers.
- Start playback of your program by pressing PLAY/PAUSE ►II.

Erasing a program

You can erase the contents of the memory by:


- pressing the CD door open;
- moving the source selector position;
- pressing STOP twice during playback / in stop position
- The display will show 'no' briefly and PROGRAM, which disappear when the programme is cancelled.






PLAYING A CASSETTE

- 1. Set the source selector to TAPE/OFF.
- Press STOP•OPEN ≜ to open the cassette holder and insert a cassette.
- 3. Close the cassette holder.
- 5. Adjust the sound using the VOLUME, INCREDIBLE SURROUND and BASS controls
- 6. To interrupt playback press PAUSE II. To resume, press the key again.
- 7. By pressing i or →, fast winding of the tape is possible in both directions. To stop fast winding, press STOP•OPEN ≜.
- 8. To stop the tape, press STOP•OPEN ▲.
 - → The keys are automatically released at the end of the tape, except if PAUSE II has been activated.
- With the source selector in TAPE/OFF position, the set is switched off when all the cassette keys are released.



General information on cassette recording

- Recording is permissible insofar as copyright or other rights of third parties are not infringed.
- This deck is not suitable for recording on CHROME (IEC II) or METAL (IEC IV) type cassettes. For recording you should use-NORMAL type cassettes (IEC I) on which the tabs have not been broken.
- The recording level is set automatically. Altering the VOLUME, INCREDIBLE SURROUND and bass controls will not affect the recording in progress.
- At the very beginning and end of the tape, no recording will take place during the 7 seconds, when the leader tape passes the recorder heads.
- To protect a tape from accidental erasure have the tape in front of you and break out the left tab. Recording on this side is no longer possible. To record over this side again, cover the tabs with a piece of adhesive tape.



SYNCHRO START CD RECORDING


- 1. Set the source selector to CD.
- 2. Insert a CD and if desired, program track numbers.
- 3. Press STOP•OPEN to open the cassettte holder.
- 4. Insert a blank tape.
- 4. Close the cassette holder.
- 5. Press RECORD to start recording.
 - → Playing of the CD programme starts automatically from the beginning of the programme. It is not necessary to start the CD player separately.
- For brief interruptions, press PAUSE II. To resume recording, press PAUSE II again.
- 7. To stop recording press STOP•OPEN ▲.





 - → Recording will begin from this exact point in the track when you press **RECORD** ●.






RECORDING FROM THE RADIO


- 1. Set the source selector to MW/FM
- Tune to the desired radio station using (See RADIO RECEPTION).
- 4. Close the cassette holder.
- 5. Press RECORD to start recording.
- For brief interruptions, press PAUSE II. To resume recording, press PAUSE II again.
- 7. To stop recording, press STOP•OPEN ▲.



PRECAUTIONS & GENERAL MAINTENANCE


- Place the set on a hard, flat surface so that the system does not tilt.
- Do not expose the set, CDs, batteries or cassettes to humidity, rain, sand or excessive heat caused by heating equipment or direct sunlight.
- Do not cover the set. Adequate ventilation with a minimum gap of 15 cms between the ventilation holes and surrounding surfaces is necessary to prevent heat build-up.
- The mechanical parts of the set contain self-lubricating bearings and must not be oiled or lubricated.
- To clean the set, use a soft, slightly dampened chamois leather. Do not use any cleaning agents containing alcohol, ammonia, benzene or abrasives as these may harm the housing.





CD PLAYER AND CD HANDLING

- The lens of the CD player should never be touched.
- Sudden changes in the surrounding temperature can cause condensation to form and the lens of your CD player to cloud over. Playing a CD is then not possible. Do not attempt to clean the lens but leave the set in a warm environment until the moisture evaporates.
- Use only Digital Audio CDs
- To take a CD out of its box, press the centre spindle while lifting the CD. Always pick up the CD by the edge and replace the CD back in its box after use to avoid scratching and dust.
- To clean the CD, wipe in a straight line from the centre towards the edge using a soft, lint-free cloth. Do not use cleaning agents as they may damage the disc.
- Never write on a CD or attach stickers to it.




TAPE DECK MAINTENANCE

To ensure a good recording and playback of the tape deck, clean parts (A), (B) and (C) show in the diagram below, after approx. 50 hours of operation, or on average once a month. Use a cotton bud slightly moistened with alcohol or a special head cleaning fluid to clean both decks.

- Open the cassette holder by pressing STOP•OPEN ▲.
- Press PAUSE II and clean the magnetic heads (A) and also the capstans (B).
- After cleaning, press STOP•OPEN ▲.

Cleaning of the heads can also be done by playing a cleaning cassette through once.



If a fault occurs, first check the points listed below before taking the set for repair. If you are unable to remedy a problem by following these hints, consult your dealer or service centre.

- Dust and dirt on the heads, etc.

- Apply a piece of adhesive tape over the missing tab space.


