

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

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


Fig. 4. Non-repetitive peak on-state current as a function of pulse width; maximum values





Fig. 5. Non-repetitive peak on-state current as a function of the number of sinusoidal current cycles; maximum values

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





Fig. 7. Normalized gate trigger current as a function of junction temperature

Normalized holding current as a function of Fig. 9. junction temperature








Fig. 12. Package outline TO-220F (SOT186A)
